	Biohazard bag;
General Guidelines	1. All specimens must include a double identification (first and last name of the patient and date of
	birth or medicare number).
	2. The use of gloves is required when handling all biological specimens.
	3. A valid requisition must include the following information :
	• First and last name of the patient, date of birth or medicare number and gender.
	• Date and time of specimen collection and signature of collector.
	• Physician's full name, signature and license number (or other qualified prescriber).
	Any relevant clinical information.
	Requested tests.
Patient Preparation	1. Any sputum with saliva or post-nasal secretions are not acceptable for testing;
	2. Only specimens obtained from a deep cough and with thick consistency are acceptable for testing.
	* Please note that specimen collection cannot be done at CDL centers.
	1) Wash hands with soap and water
	2) Rince mouth with water
	3) Open the sterile container
	4) Cough strongly and deeply 2 to 3 times to produce an expectoration from deep within the chest.
	5) Spit expectoration directly into the sterile container. A volume of at least 1mL is necessary
Specimen Collection	6) Close the container tightly
Instructions	7) Identify the container with the following information:
	First and last name
	Date of birth and Medicare number
	Date and time of collection
	8) Place the container in the biohazard bag
	9) Wash hands with soap and water
	10) Return the container as soon as possible to laboratory or physician's office.
